You are on a journey this year to become a disciple of Jesus Christ. This year we will:

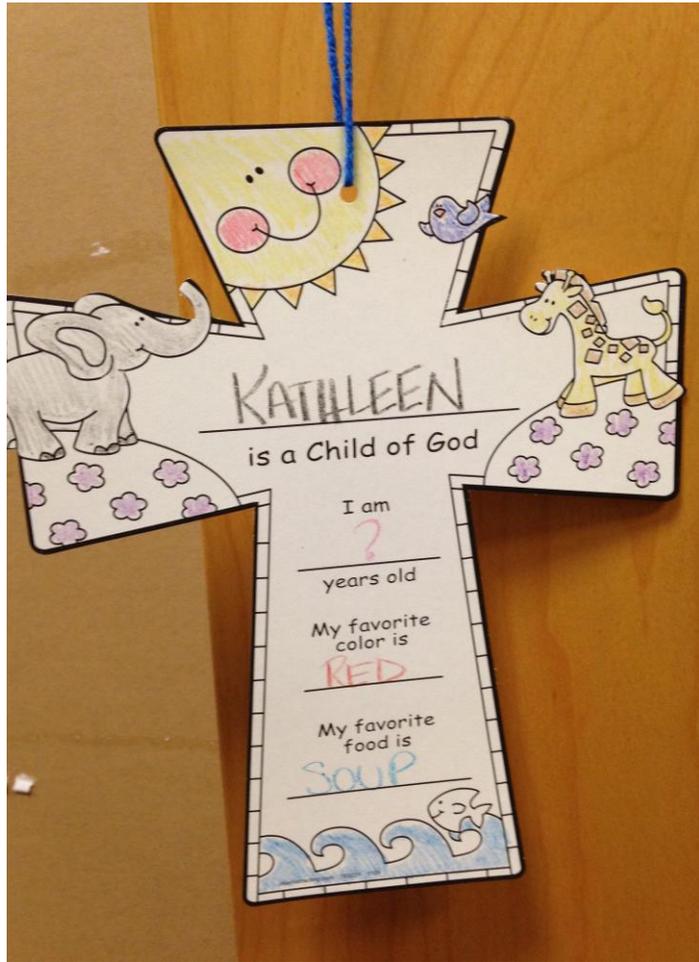
Learn the ways God has shown his love for us,

- *We Believe* – Have the children cut out and write their name on the front of the cardboard cross nametag and then color it. *The name tag should be put on whenever the children are in Religious Formation class – this is the beginning of their Catholic identity; God shows his love for us by creating us and we show our love for God by loving ourselves and others.* The catechist can string the yarn through a punched hole in the medallion. Then the catechist will place the nametag on each child claiming them for God by saying “_____ is a child of God.” *We all belong to God because we are all part of the family He created!*
