- 4:00pm Welcome (Prayer coloring page and *to ensure accuracy, class attendance must be accurately recorded by a catechist and not another student - class attendance is an official document retained by the parish and the diocese*)

(*use colored table covering for appropriate liturgical season*)
Use the Gospel Reading “Hearing the Word” from the previous Sunday in Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families book in the prayer box

Chapter #16 **“We Believe”**

Our relationship with God exists with prayer. **Prayer is communicating with God by talking, writing, listening and being together in silence.** Jesus learned to pray from his family and the Jewish community of faith. **When we gather with our family and community at Mass we are praying! When His disciples asked Him how to pray, Jesus taught them the Our Father. We find this prayer in the bible (Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:1-4) and we pray today as Jesus prayed then!**

ADORATION (Praise): We show Jesus that we love and respect the awesome gift of His true presence in the Eucharist by kneeling or sitting reverently, praying and listening in silence.
I can say “I love you, Jesus”

CONTRITION (Petition): We kneel or sit in silence to examine our conscience, acknowledge the abundance of Jesus’ mercy, and pray for the poor souls in purgatory.
I can say “I’m sorry, Jesus”

THANKSGIVING: We express gratitude for our many blessings.
I can say “Thank You, Jesus”

SUPPLICATION (Intercession): We kneel or sit reverently and humble ourselves as we offer intentions silently.
I ask Jesus for the needs of myself, my family, friends or sick people.

Jesus’ first miracle was the changing of the wine into water at the wedding in Cana. He worked miracles to prove He was the Son of God. **Miracles are acts of God! They are something extraordinary and wonderful that only God has the power to do.** Miracles lead us to faith in God. Miracles are God's direct intervention in the world.

- *We Believe –*

Our Father = the prayer Jesus our Lord taught His Apostles. It is the model for all prayer.

Miracles = something wonderful that is done by the power of God and that only God can do.

- *We Respond* – “Can You Pray?” fill in the blank (*use the whiteboard or chalk board*)

Have the students recite the different prayers and fill in the missing words of the prayer on the chalkboard or whiteboard. It is best to continue saying the prayer from the beginning and fill in one blank at a time. *The constant repetition is what we are encouraging.*
